St Catherine's has a long and rich history. It is the oldest Anglican girls' school in Australia, founded in 1856 by Jane Barker, the wife of the second Bishop of Sydney. Her vision was "to provide an education for the daughters of clergy equal to that given to boys". From its very origins with just three pupils, St Catherine's has been supported by its community – parents, staff, students and friends. This generosity has enabled the school to flourish and grow to approximately 1000 students today. Your generosity can help maintain this tradition and provide for the future of the school and the girls.

The Fielding Fellowship

The Fielding Fellowship honours the five Fielding sisters who attended St Catherine's in the 1900s. The eldest, Dr Una Fielding, commenced at St Catherine's in 1900 and later, following her studies at The University of Sydney, established an international reputation in neuro-anatomy.

The last of the sisters, Miss Ruth Fielding, died in 1992 and her wish was to establish a scholarship fund at St Catherine's to which she remained fondly attached throughout her life. Ruth Fielding was one of the founding members of the St Catherine's Old Girls' Union. The scholarship commenced in 1994 and continues today to recognise students of exceptional ability.

Our vision for a St Catherine's girl is:

"That she is secure in her character, confident in her abilities, respectful in her manner, and equipped to make her unique contribution to the world."



Why bequests are important to St Catherine's

For well over 150 years, St Catherine's girls have forged their way with all the benefits of a St Catherine's education. Your bequest, made to support the school's philanthropic programs, will provide for generations of St Catherine's students long into the future.

St Catherine's income is derived primarily from school fees and government grants of which 71% is directed towards staffing and associated teaching costs. Through your bequest, you will not only invest in St Catherine's future but you will also assist in ensuring our girls reach their maximum potential.

Frequently asked questions

What is a bequest?

A bequest is a gift specified in your will which provides a way for you to make a lasting gift while still enjoying your assets during your lifetime.

How do I make a bequest?

Your bequest is a very personal decision and there are a number of ways you can make this valuable contribution to St Catherine's:

- By bequeathing a specific sum of money, entirely of your choice, which may be a fixed amount or a percentage of your estate.
- By bequeathing non-cash assets such as property, paintings, shares, etc.

Bequests are generally of two types:

- I. Unrestricted: An unrestricted bequest leads to your gift being allocated at the Headmistress' discretion to where it is needed most at the time of receipt.
- 2. Restricted: If you have a particular passion, perhaps for a scholarship or specific academic area, you may wish to consider a restricted bequest directed to that particular purpose.

We recommend that you involve your family in your decision and that you seek the advice of your solicitor. Making a bequest does not always entail re-writing your will. A simple codicil provides an easy option for this special gift.

You might like to consider the following wording:

"I give to St Catherine's School, Waverley [description of bequest] and I direct that the receipt of the Headmistress or the Director of Finance shall be sufficient discharge to my Executor for this bequest".

Do I have to tell St Catherine's what I am leaving?

No, but it is always helpful for the school to know as your gift will assist with future planning. Please be assured your bequest notification will always be treated with respect and confidentiality.

Do I have to be an Old Girl to leave a bequest?

No, not at all. We are delighted if any members of our school community choose to leave a bequest.

Through your bequest, you will not only invest in St Catherine's future but you will also assist in ensuring our girls reach their maximum potential.
